- 1. Was a stand-up comedian: "My gravitational pull was towards solitude."
- 2. Was a radio and television comedy writer on such classics as *The Day Today* with Steve Coogan and Chris Morris, and *Knowing Me, Knowing You*.
- 3. Had his first play, *Dealer's Choice*, staged in 1995. It was followed by a new version of Strindberg's *Miss Julie* for BBC television a tale, like *Closer*, of sexual tension and the reversibility of desire.
- 4. Hopes that the dramatic power of the play rests on a tension between an "elegant structure" and "inelegant emotion."

The Play

- 5. Is set in London in the 1990s.
- 6. Was first staged at the Royal National Theatre in May, 1997 and transferred to the West End in the March of the following year.
- 7. Has been performed in 100 cities and 30 different languages worldwide.
- 8. Has won numerous awards, including the Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Play (1997) and the New York Drama Critics' Circle Award for Best Foreign Play (1999).
- 9. Was made into a film in 2004, directed by Mike Nichols and starring Julia Roberts, Jude Law, Clive Owen and Natalie Portman. Marber's own screenplay was nominated for a BAFTA and a Golden Globe Award.
- 10. "...is Les Liasons Dangereuses with the moral component removed...a cutthroat bridge tournament." (Michael Feingold, The Village Voice.) "A bruising dissection of modern relationships." (Richard Zoglin, Time.)


