

Perhaps this is why the government has recently been seeking to outlaw lovemaking in the great outdoors in the upcoming sex offences bill. They are not getting a satisfactory and varied sex-life, so why should anyone else. One of the MP's behind this bill, explaining the inclusion of the ban on sex outside the confines of the home, said that no one wants to unwittingly stumble upon a couple having sex.

I wonder how many people he asked? Maybe he took a straw poll at a meeting of the local 'Mrs. Grundy out walking her dog' club? Or perhaps he consulted the staff of the Daily Mail? He certainly didn't ask me, because I would have told him what I consider to be the most sensible reaction to such a situation. It seems to me that the decent thing to do would be to either watch from a safe distance until one became bored or, if the couple saw you, apologise for having broken their concentration and walk away, somewhat slower than usual, hoping for an invitation to join in!

So, the government is trying to play sexual party poopers, but to counteract that, I give you Habeas Corpus. One of the reasons I love the play is that it celebrates sexuality and the body. We see how much more alive people become when desires, which have lain dormant, are suddenly awakened and allowed to express themselves. We see the enjoyment which can be had from the human body, no matter how young or old, or what shape or size. And we see the great variety in couplings which desire can bring.

So, enjoy the play and if, in the summer, you should be lucky enough to stumble upon a brave outlaw couple bonking on a beach or fucking in a forest, you will know what to do!

In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing sub-committee of Leeds City Council:

- The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exits and entrance doors and such doors must at all times be kept open
- b) All gangways, passages and staircases must be kept entirely free from chairs or other obstructions.
- Persons shall not be permitted to stand in any of the intersecting gangways, or stand in any other unseated space in the auditorium, unless standing in such space has been specially allowed by the Licensing Sub-Committee. A notice is exhibited in that part of the auditorium in which standing has been sanctioned.
- d) The safety curtain must be lowered and raised once immediately before the commencement of each performance to show that it is in proper working order.
