#### A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Probably the best known of Caryl Churchill's plays, Top Girls is a classic of modern theatre. Set in the early 1980s, the play explores the changing role of women in society and the workplace, the choices women make and the impact these choices have on their future.

The format of the play is unusual, with a long opening scene in which Marlene, our central character, hosts a drinks party to which she has invited a number of influential women from literature, art and history. The play then goes on to follow Marlene in her workplace and on a visit to her estranged family.

The script often calls for characters to speak over each other, bringing a naturalistic feel to the way the characters speak, but breaking the traditions of theatre, where actors usually wait for their cue to finish before speaking.

I first came across this play when I worked backstage on a production as a teenager. I instantly loved the play, the strong female characters and wonderful mix of humour and drama throughout. There are few plays with all female casts and it has been a great opportunity for the actresses in the cast to show what they can do. The discussions in rehearsal about who the characters are, how they relate to each other and the choices they have made have been fascinating and have added to the cast's portrayal of these often complex women.

I would like to thank my incredibly hard working cast and crew for their commitment and support.


